

Dialog for a Real Emergency

(Note : The first licensed operator on the scene will be the net controller until the assigned one shows up.)

QST QST, QST, This is the Oasis Emergency Communications Net

Name Call sign Is establishing an Emergency Net due to Type of incident

This Net will use 146.490 MHz, Simplex

(Note: Request over the airways the use on this frequency.)

(Note: if it is only a drill, say so along with an estimate of the time needed)

“All Emcomm personnel are requested to either check in by radio or report to the club house for assignments.”

“A full roll call will begin shortly.”

Remember:

Keep all radio communications to the minimum needed.

Acknowledge all received transmissions, so the party will know they were successful.

Use plain English (do not use codes, such as 10-4)

Use first name only with call signs.

It is okay to use only first names on the net since we know each other by voice.

“I will now start roll call.”

(Note: As you call roll place a check mark next to those who are present for duty.)

(Note: Request every 20 minutes or so the use of this frequency and if it is only a drill say so.)

(Note: Relay all radio communications to the incident commander, do not take any actions unless so order by the Incident Commander (IC). Always response to all requests from the IC.)

To secure the net after the emergency is over:

“I will now secure this net and return the frequency to normal amateur use.”

“73” This is Call sign Clear.
