



Protocol for UHF Net (445.620 MHz/-/173.8)

Opening the Net: Use the new Club Call Sign, and your name.

Is the frequency in use? <N6MVA> (Name) (BREAK)

QRZ A clear frequency is requested. If at any time there is emergency or priority traffic, the Net will standby. (BREAK)

QST The Menifee Valley Amateur Radio Club meets on this frequency twice a month; every 2nd Wednesday at 6.30 pm; every 4th Wednesday at 10.30 am. All licensed operators are welcome.

This is a Directed Net, meaning all traffic must go through the Net Control station, which today is <N6MVA> (Name) (location)

If there are any urgent announcements, please come now. (BREAK)

I will first make an **open call** for Club Member check-ins, as per the latest website Club Net check-in form, then a call for Guest check-ins.

Missed or late check-ins will be called, more than once.

After check-ins, I will go down the list for **ONE round** of comments only, with the Guests being called first. Interactive Responses during the round of comments will be directed via Net Control.

When checking in, give your full Call Sign, Name, and Location, Slowly and Clearly, please. <N6MVA> (BREAK)

Club members, open call, come now: Then call for Guest check ins. Guest comments; Member comments; Interactions?

Missed/Late check-ins?;
